On December 25, 2020, our friend, scientist and former President of the Society for ETRAN lost the battle of his life

Academician Ninoslav Stojadinović

9/20/1950 - 12/25/2020



Ninoslav Stojadinović was elected a corresponding member of the Serbian Academy of Sciences and Arts (SANU) in 2003, and an academician in 2012. He was elected the first president of the Branch of SANU in Niš in 2016. His efforts since then resulted with over 250 activities in the town of Niš and Southern Serbia. He left an exceptional mark in the field of microelectronics and nanoelectronics and an immeasurable contribution to the constitution and overall work of the Branch of SANU in Niš. His scientific work and activities are related to the Faculty of Electronics, the University of Niš. Ninoslav Stojadinović has made a great contribution as a member of the Academy of Engineering Sciences of Serbia (AESS) since its founding in 1999.

Academician Stojadinović's scientific works are often cited, and from his fundamental and applied research, innovations have emerged, six of which have been applied in the semiconductor industry in our country and in the world.

Ninoslav Stojadinović was the editor of the "Microelectronics Journal" (Elsevier), "Microelectronics Reliability" (Elsevier) and "Facta Universitatis, Series: Electronics and Energetics" (University of Niš) and a member of numerous international professional organizations. Conference on Microelectronics - MIEL, which became one of the most important scientific conferences in the field in Europe and was on the list of IEEE conferences, was a visiting professor at the Technical University of Wien and a member of the international scientific committees of the Center for Nanotechnology (Clemson University, USA) and the European Union Center of Excellence for Micro and Nanotechnology Research (Technical University Warsaw, Poland) He was also a member of the EU Expert Commission for the EC FP7 program, and a consultant to the Science Foundation of the Government of Taiwan.

Academician Stojadinović had significant political and diplomatic activities. He was a member of the National Assembly of the Republic of Serbia (1997-2000), a member of the Assembly of the State Union of Serbia and Montenegro, and its representative in the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe (2004-2006), Vice President of the National Assembly of the Republic of Serbia (2014-2016). He was the Ambassador of the Republic of Serbia to the Kingdom of Sweden (2005-2011) and Bosnia and Herzegovina (2011-2013). He has won several awards and recognitions for his dedicated work.

He unfortunately lost the battle with the COVID-19. The death of Ninoslav Stojadinović is a great loss for the Society for ETRAN, SANU, AINS and the entire Serbian science, but definitely the biggest for his wife Andjelka and son Dragan.
